The school-sponsored dress policy exists in order to provide students individual freedom while promoting a climate of academic excellence. The policy will:

- ensure student safety;
- avoid distractions caused by provocative, inappropriate, or symbolic fashion statements;
- maintain LuHi's professional climate;
- provide an environment of socio-economic equity.

The following items are not acceptable:

- t-shirts
- plaid, rugby, or striped shirts
- cargo items of any kind (pants, shorts, skirts, skorts)
- hooded sweaters, cardigans, or sweatshirts

*Sweatshirts and zip-up fleece must be ordered with the school logo.*

### **Please Note:**

- Uniform clothing components are to be worn from the time the student arrives on campus to the end of the school day.
- Uniform clothing components are to be worn for all field trips unless the students are specifically exempted by the supervisor in consultation with the school administration.
- Uniform shorts may be worn from the start of the school year through October 31 and again from April 1 through the end of the school year.
- Black, brown, or burgundy belts must be worn with pants and shorts. All pants must be worn at the waist.
- Socks (or for girls, stockings, which fully cover the leg and foot) must be worn from November 1 through March 31.
- Below knee fashion boots may be worn from November 1 through March 31.
- Dress shoes, strap-backed sandals, and laced-up, clean sneakers are acceptable footwear.
- Dress oxford shirts and blouses may not be opened beyond the second top button and must be long enough to remain tucked in. Long-sleeve shirts are not to be worn under short-sleeve shirts.
- Polo shirts and turtlenecks, appropriately sized, do not need to be tucked in. They must not appear sloppy. Shirts worn under the uniform shirt or blouse must be of one color, must not have writing or graphics, and must not extend beyond the sleeves of the shirt, or the bottom hem of the shirt be excessively long.
- The zip-up fleece does not need to be tucked in. The zip-up fleece must be worn over a component shirt or blouse.
- If a student is considering a change in hairstyle, hair color, or personal appearance which might be considered inappropriate for the norm at LuHi, the student should check with the Administration before making any changes. Hairstyles should generally not have a dramatic variety in length. The completely or excessively shaved head is not appropriate.
- State law mandates that headwear is not to be worn in school. Should a student be wearing an item of headwear, it will be confiscated and NOT returned. Girls may wear hair bands no wider than two inches.
- Sunglasses are not to be worn in school. Should a student be wearing sunglasses, the glasses will be confiscated and NOT returned.

**STYLES, TRENDS, AND FADS:** Styles come and go and no one has control over what is in vogue at a particular time. That being said, there are some “looks” that at times will be found to be unacceptable. Of special concern are fads that have come to symbolize elements in our society that are not in keeping with the mission and expectation of LuHi. During the course of the school year additional items may need to be added to this group. Presently this group includes items such as:

- steel ball or “chain link” jewelry or accessories;
- chains/straps hanging out of pockets and/or attached to wallets;
- excessively long belt ends that are not tucked into belt loops;
- black lipstick and nail polish;
- jewelry symbolic of sub-culture groups or extremist movements;
- any body piercing that is distracting;
- distracting stockings;
- above the knee fashion boots;
- slippers of any kind;
- flip flops.

The effectiveness of the dress code is evaluated at the end of each school year by the administration, faculty, and Board of Directors.
